#### **FINAL EXAM POLICY**

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to provide clear direction to Schools, instructors, and students on rights and responsibilities with respect to final exams. Moreover, this policy articulates Camosun College's values, principles, and conditions around final exam deferrals and final exam rewrites.

#### POLICY APPLICATION, SCOPE, AND/OR LIMITS

This policy applies to all Camosun College courses in which there are final exams at the end of the course.

This policy does not apply to final term assignments, presentations, group projects (or any final evaluation that is not a final exam). This policy also does not apply to midterms, quizzes, assignments, or group projects or other term work (see definition).

This policy also does not apply to final exams that are administered by authorized professional governing bodies, trade licensure bodies, or industry training authorities.

This policy is not intended to be used to request a review of a course grade or the grade on a final exam. To request the review of a final course grade, please refer to the <u>Grade Review and Appeals policy</u> and its associated <u>processes</u>.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

1. Exam Deferral: A privilege, granted to a student under extenuating circumstances, in which the student is permitted to write their final exam at a date or time other than the scheduled date and time of the exam.

- 2. Exam Rewrite: A privilege, granted to a student under extenuating circumstances, in which the student is permitted to rewrite or reattempt their final exam after already haven completed the exam.
- **3.** Final Exam: A terminal, often timed, summative evaluation at the end a course.
- **4. Term Work**: All constituent evaluations that are used to calculate the final grade.

#### **PRINCIPLES**

- 1. Camosun College is committed to evaluating student learning in a fair and equitable manner and acknowledges that final exams are one of the many ways in which students can demonstrate their learning.
- 2. All final exams will occur during the final exam period. Students are expected to write tests and final examinations at the scheduled time and place. Final exam schedules will be posted. Where possible, students will write no more than two final examinations on the same day.
- 3. Camosun College understands that extenuating circumstances and hardships may arise that may make it challenging for students to undertake a final examination at its scheduled date or time. Instructors may permit the deferral of scheduled final exams under specific conditions and circumstances.
- **4.** Camosun College acknowledges that extenuating circumstances and hardships faced by a student may significantly jeopardize the student's performance on a final exam to the point of failure in the course. Under specific circumstances, and if appropriate for the course or program, instructors may permit a student to rewrite or reattempt a final exam.
- **5.** Exam deferral and exam rewrite opportunities articulated in this policy are privileges afforded to the student by their instructors and by the college. When requesting an exam deferral or exam rewrite opportunity, students must meet the conditions and requirements set out in this policy.

#### STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR FINAL EXAM DEFERRALS

#### 1. Final Exam Deferrals Due to Scheduling Issues

When a student has more than two final exams scheduled on one day, the student is to contact the instructor(s) to discuss alternate arrangements. In emergency circumstances, a student may write a test or final examination before or after the scheduled time if the student would otherwise be unable to complete the program or course.

2. Final Exam Deferrals Due to Personal Emergency or Extenuating Circumstances

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Exam deferrals due to personal emergency or extenuating circumstances that are beyond the student's control may be afforded to the student at the discretion of the course instructor. Students may be asked to provide documentation to validate their request for an exam deferral.

All exam deferral requests due to personal emergency or extenuating circumstances must be made prior to attempting the scheduled exam. Requests for exam deferrals will not be considered once the student has attempted the exam.

Examples of personal emergency or extenuating circumstances include

- a. A sudden physical or mental illness,
- b. A serious injury or ailment to the student or significant other,
- c. Bereavement (e.g. death of a family member or close friend),
- d. Traumatic life event (e.g. family breakdown; domestic violence, sexualized violence; for sexualized violence, please see Camosun's <u>Sexualized Violence and Misconduct policy</u> and <u>procedures</u>),
- e. Adverse local weather conditions that make it difficult for the student to be present inperson for the final exam (e.g. snow or flooding that makes travel dangerous),
- f. Civic responsibility (e.g. jury duty, being required to report to a government office for immigration or citizenship proceedings),
- g. Religious observance,
- h. Participation in indigenous ceremony or cultural activity that requires the student to be absent from the college for the examination period.

The following are not valid examples of personal emergency or extenuating circumstances:

- a. Personal or family events (weddings, birthdays),
- b. Planned holidays or scheduled flights for trips.

#### 3. Final Exam Deferrals for Students Who Are Absent for a Final Exam

A student who misses a final exam due to personal emergency or an extenuating circumstance must inform their instructor and request an exam deferral no later than **two (2) business days** following the scheduled final exam. Students must provide a rationale for missing the final exam. Documentation may be requested by the instructor to validate the student's request.

If the absentee student does not communicate with the instructor or does not provide appropriate documentation, then the student may risk failing the exam.

4. Final Exam Deferrals for Students with Disabilities Seeking Academic Accommodations
Student with disabilities must follow the <u>Academic Accommodations for Students with</u>
<u>Disabilities policy</u>, should they require a final exam deferral as part of their accommodation.
Please follow the steps outlined in the <u>Academic Accommodations for Exams</u> website and contact the <u>Centre for Accessible Learning</u> for specifics related to your accommodation.

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#### STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR FINAL EXAM REWRITES

- 1. Students may request a final exam rewrite within **five (5) business days** of the final mark being posted on myCamosun.
- 2. Final exam rewrites will only be considered for students who fail a course as a result of failing the final exam. Students who fail the final exam but still pass the course are ineligible for a final exam rewrite.
- **3.** Final exam rewrite requests will generally only be considered for a student who meets all three (a, b, & c) following conditions:
  - a. Has undergone a personal emergency or extenuating circumstance. Students may be asked to provide documentation to validate their request to rewrite a final exam.
     Examples of a personal emergency or extenuating circumstance that may warrant a final exam rewrite include:
    - i. A sudden physical or mental illness,
    - ii. A serious injury or ailment to the student or significant other,
    - iii. Bereavement (e.g. death of a family member or close friend),
    - iv. Traumatic life event (e.g. family breakdown; domestic violence, sexualized violence).
  - b. Is in satisfactory academic standing in the course prior to the final exam.
    - i. The student must have a course grade of 65% (C+) or above in the course prior to the final exam, and;
    - ii. Must have completed all other evaluations in the course to be eligible for final exam rewrite opportunity.
  - c. Failed the final exam within 10% of the passing mark for the exam.
- **4.** The maximum final grade a student can achieve after passing an exam rewrite shall be the minimum passing grade for the course.
  - a. If the course is a prerequisite, then the maximum grade a student is entitled to after passing the exam rewrite is the minimum grade required for progression in a program.
  - b. In the event that the student passes the final exam rewrite but still does not achieve the minimum passing grade for the course or prerequisite, then the student will receive the weighted average of the marks received on the final exam rewrite and their previously completed evaluations.
- 5. In the event that the student is approved for a final exam rewrite, an "Incomplete" (I) grade will be placed on the student's record until the student has rewritten the final exam. Please see Camosun's <u>Grading policy</u> for details on assigning "Incomplete" (I) grades and how to convert a temporary grade to a final grade.
- **6.** Final exam rewrite requests due to sexualized violence will be considered under the <u>Sexualized</u> Violence and Misconduct policy.
