### Ε. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL **Bijan Ahmadi** The minutes for the May 15, 2024 meeting were approved by unanimous consent. F. REPORTS 1. **Education Council Chair Bijan Ahmadi** Bijan thanked members who attended the Special Election and thanked Chris for running the meeting (Bijan Ahmadi acclaimed as Chair, Andrea Kucherawy acclaimed as Vice-Chair). He recognized and thanked the five members of the Council whose terms are coming to an end (Ryan Russell, Ed Nelson – faculty; Ivy Bell, Navreet Singh Sidhu, Ritika – students). 2. **Provost and VP Education and Innovation** John Boraas John acknowledged this time of the year that highlight the accomplishments of the College and the students we serve, noting the celebrations of student awards season and graduation. He thanked everyone who serves the students and the aims of the College, and to share that pride and appreciation with their colleagues. **Dr. Monty Bryant Board Member** 3. Monty reported that the audited financial statements for year ending March 31 were presented to the Board with a \$1.1 million surplus. KPMG report indicated no audit findings. Laura Friesen and Heather Del Villano provided a presentation on the Employment Training and Preparation program. The Institutional Accountability Plan and report was presented by Rodney Porter. The Board approved this, subject to approval by the executive committee once the information comes back from the Ministry. Tanya Clarmont was re-elected as Board Chair until 2025. G. **COMMITTEE REPORTS Education Council Policy and Standards Committee** Peter Moroney Pete reported that the committee met on June 3. The Academic Accommodations Concessions Policy was discussed, looking at splitting out the human rights accommodations from regular concessions. What has emerged is that while we have a robust framework in place for academic accommodations for persons with disabilities, we don't have that for other human rights accommodations that we are obligated to fulfill. Strategies were discussed around how to deal with this, with continued conversations to be had. Following the discussions had at EdCo regarding the Education Council bylaws, the proposed changes were reviewed and discussed. This included a report by Bijan from the Academic Governance Council meetings he attended. There are two items that P&S is settled on and that EdCo will likely support, in addition to the one

### outstanding item of adding an Indigenous voice to EdCo. This will be covered during the consult later on.

### Sybil Harrison Ι. **PRESENTATION – STUDENT EXPERIENCE SURVEY FINDINGS** Sybil presented on the Student Experience Survey Findings from 2024, highlighting the feedback students provided about their experience in classes and courses. This year's survey theme asked questions about demographics, learning skills and other outside factors that impact the student's ability to have a successful learning experience. There were 1,934 participants/20% participation rate. She's hopeful that the College can review and identify areas to respond to, and to connect back to the students who responded to the survey. Council members provided feedback regarding considerations for future student surveys. Bijan Ahmadi J. **EDUCATION COUNCIL BYLAWS - CONSULT** Peter Moroney Bijan provided an update on the discussions about the Education Council Bylaws and the changes being considered (Potential role of Education Council Coordinator (strike in sec. 4 – Permanent Secretary and insert, Education Council Coordinator); Pete's role - he's a member of two EdCo sub-committees (P&S/ICC) thus sufficient to maintain him as a non-voting member). These will be brought forward later. He shared what he brought forth to Policy & Standards regarding the addition of an Indigenous Voice/Representative voting member, and how we could move it forward. He attended the Academic Governance Council meeting last month, where he provided insight on how other institutions are adding membership to their councils. The advice he received was, "Who are we to say what to do?" We need to step away from the current, move back to the edge, and recognize that to provide effective and valuable Indigenous voice, we should draw from the Indigenous community and ask them how best to do that. By doing that, it's not just educational leadership asking Todd what to do but drawing it back to a larger community. We need to engage more Indigenous voices within this process. Bijan

### PRESENTER

**Christopher Avis** 

	has asked Todd for guidance to find the community or group that can help this decision to move forward. He is committed to engaging with a broader Indigenous community to ask what the best process looks like from their perspective, and to bring that back to Policy & Standards and ultimately EdCo. To ensure the work that we do moving forward represents not our belief of what is right, but something that is drawn from the community that we're trying to represent. He sought Council's support in taking these next steps.

## ABOUT US

CAMOSUN HAS AN OUTSTANDING REPUTATION

The Education Council is a legislated governance body established under the College and Institute Act. The purpose of the council is to provide leadership and decision-making for the College in the areas outlined in the College and Institute Act (Section 24), such as setting policies concerning examinations and evaluation of student performance, setting criteria for academic standing, academic standards and the grading system, and setting curriculum content for courses leading to certificates, diplomas or degrees. The council also acts in an advisory role to the board as outlined in Section 23 of the Act, and has joint approval with the board in the area of articulation as outlined in Section 25 of the Act.

By far the greatest area of focus for the Education Council is in the area of curriculum approval. The Council has established curriculum standards and continually monitors that the standards are maintained. Camosun has an outstanding reputation for quality curriculum.

### Education Council is made up of:

- 10 faculty members elected by faculty members
- 4 students elected by students
- 4 educational administrators appointed by the President
- 2 support staff elected by support staff
- 1 Board member appointed by the board as a non-voting member
- The President, as a non-voting member
- An Education Council Coordinator, as a non-voting member
- Integrated Curriculum Committee Chair, as a non-voting member
- Indigenization Coordinator, as a non-voting member

# OUR MANDATE

The mandate of the council is to ensure that Camosun students are provided with quality educational experiences, and that Camosun graduates are recognized for their contemporary and relevant educational backgrounds. This mandate is enacted through two key responsibilities: establishing educational standards and advising the Board on educational policy.

### **GOVERNANCE, MANAGEMENT, AND OPERATIONS**

Education Council is a "governance body". The role of governance is about vision and translating that vision into policy. Education Council members are expected to act in good faith; and demonstrate stewardship, transparency, and integrity. Education Council members are equally and jointly responsible for decision-making. There is no hierarchy to Education Council.

Education Council members will govern by setting direction and providing vision with regard to curriculum, educational issues, and educational policy. Education Council regularly reviews their current policies and standards to ensure currency and relevance. In addition, Education Council may identify gaps, and emerging curriculum and educational quality issues that require advice, direction, standards, or policy. These gaps and issues often emerge through the curriculum review and approvals process.

Education Council members will set direction and provide vision with regard to curriculum, educational issues, and educational policy. It should be remembered that good governance does not involve "management". Management of the curriculum, educational issues, or educational policy is the responsibility of the Administration of the institution (e.g. VP Education, the Education Leadership Team, etc.). There is a hierarchy to our management; and management is the body responsible for resourcing and delegating work as required.

In addition, the Integrated Curriculum Committe and the school curriculum committees are all tasked with doing the various work of Education Council. These working teams are about putting into operation the vision of Education Council and making recommendations to Education Council for review and approval.

It should be remembered that Education Council's role is not to replicate work that has already taken place in these working teams. Education Council should trust that the working teams are operationalizing the vision, direction, standards and policy set out by Education Council.



## DISCUSSION Strategy In Meetings

Education Council discussions are intended to promote deep critical thinking and conversations that require the analysis, synthesis and evaluation of issues and topics relevant to our mandate: however to do that members need to have a foundation of knowledge, comprehension, and application. Below is strategy that outlines an increasing level of discussion complexity for the adoption of a proposed policy. Our aim is to ultimately move the discussion forward from surface level to deep conversation.

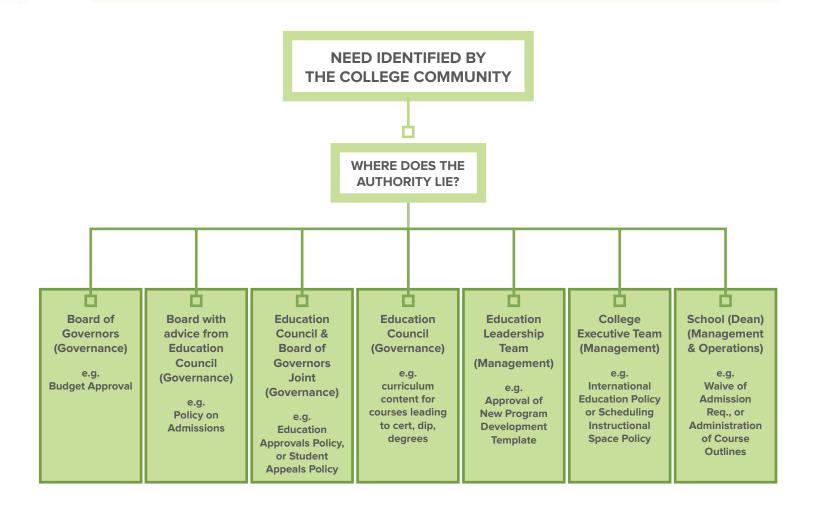

Elected members whose terms expire in the upcoming academic year. If you want to complete another term be sure to put forward your name at nomination time in March 2025.

### AGENDA PACKAGE SCHEDULE AND CONTENTS

Council meetings will be governed by Robert's Rules of Orders, except as otherwise provided in Education Council By-Laws. The terms and rules provided below are not comprehensive; however they are ones that may be most useful for the majority of business we conduct.

### ABSTENTION

To refrain and/or refuse to vote. Note that an abstention does not affect quorum (stated in the Education Council by-laws) as voting is based on members present. An abstention at Education Council is an oxymoron, as it is a "non-vote", that has the effect of a "NO" vote.

### **ADJOURN**

To close a meeting. Note that is the meeting is not yet over and the council wishes to close it they will need a majority vote.

### MOTION

A formal proposal by a member, in a meeting, that a group take certain action on.

### It is followed by:

- 1. A member who seconds it
- 2. The Chair who restates it
- 3. The Council who debates it
- 4. The Chair who "puts the question" (calls a vote)
- 5. The Chair who announces the results

### **MOTION TO AMEND**

If a main motion might be more suitable or acceptable in an altered form (e.g. change wording to either clarify or within limits to modify the meeting), you can make a motion to amend.

### MOTION TO "COMMIT" OR "REFER TO COMMITTEE"

If more time is required to amend a motion, or additional information is needed, so that it would be better to turn it over to a committee for study or redrafting, you can make a motion to "commit" or "refer to committee".

### **MOTION TO RECONSIDER**

If a member changes their mind on a motion that has been either adopted or defeated during the meeting, they can make a motion to reconsider. Note that it must be made during the same meeting and only by a member on the winning side. It can be seconded by a member no matter how they voted.

### MOTION TO RESCIND, RENEW, OR AMEND

If a member changes their mind on a motion that has been either adopted or defeated at a previous meeting, they can make a motion to rescind (on a motion approved), renew (on a motion defeated) or amend (make a change in wording on a motion approved or defeated). Note there are rules on the number of required votes (either majority or 2/3) to pass these motions as outlined in Robert's Rules of Order.

### QUORUM

The minimum number of members (50% + 1) required to conduct Education Council business. Leaving an Education Council meeting may affect this.

### **ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER**

Henry M. Robert first derived this in 1876 from English parliamentary procedures and practices. It has become accepted as the standard authoritative work on meeting rules and procedures, and is used by Education Council to conduct our business.

### **UNANIMOUS CONSENT**

It enables a motion to be adopted or some action being taken without the necessity of having the chair state the question on a motion and putting it to a vote. The Chair simply asks the assembly if there is any objection to taking the desired action, and if no member objects, the chair declares the action has been agreed to.

## THE EDUCATION APPROVAL PROCESS

As per the College and Institute Act, Education Council approves all curricula that leads to a Camosun College credential or provides advice to the Board of Governors on the cancellation of programs. The education approvals process was established to facilitate this responsibility. As such, it guides the review, recommendation and approval of all curriculum changes that leads to a Camosun College credential.

Approximately 100+ Camosun faculty, staff and administration annually participate in the development, review, approval, and implementation of curriculum. By the time curriculum reaches the Education Council table it has been thoroughly vetted by numerous departments, committees and individuals; and has potentially undergone multiple revisions as a result of the process.

### **CURRICULUM CHANGES ARE CATEGORIZED AS FOLLOWS:**

### Category 1 Change: Board/Ministry Approval

Curricular changes that are at the Board of Governors or Ministry Policy or Governance levels; or result in new or cancelled credentials. They are under the authority of the Camosun College Board and/or the Ministry of Advanced Education to approve.

### Category 2 Change: EdCo Approval

Curricular changes that are at the College, Program, EdCo Policy, or EdCo Governance level; result in the addition or cancellation of course offerings; or that create barriers for students. The changes are delegated to the Integrated Curriculum Committee to recommend and for Education Council to approve.

### • Category 3 Change: Dean or Designate Approval

Curricular changes that are at the School or Course level; or that are editing, correcting or the result of cascading changes. The changes can be delegated to the School Departments and Committees to recommend and the Dean or Designate to approve and sign-off. In some cases, these changes may be re-designated Cat 2 changes if there is a greater impact to the curriculum/college than originally understood.
