Projects:

To provide practical experience you will be completing four projects including the preparation of T5s, T4s, a T1 and a GST Project that uses big data.

The GST Big Data Project uses Excel Pivot Tables. You will need to use the desktop version of Office365, which is available free for student download (https://legacy.camosun.ca/services/its/other-services.html).

The T1 project uses Profile Software (<u>not MAC compatible</u>). A link is provided on D2L if you wish to download the student version of the software to your personal computer. If you have not had experience with Profile software previously, you are strongly advised to review the training from Profile (see link on D2L). The project covers all topics in personal tax.

All the work in your project must be your own individual work. All projects are NOT group projects. Please feel free to discuss the projects with each other; however, you must complete the projects on your own.

If you miss the deadline for any projects, you will receive a zero grade - no exceptions. There will be no make up projects regardless of your reason for missing them. The strict rule is because the due dates are provided to you with advance notice – plan ahead!

Quiz:

One quiz will be dropped and the one to be dropped will be the lowest grade of all.

The quizzes are for individual learning purposes. They are to be done individually. They are not to be done in a group. If you cannot successfully challenge the quizzes by applying concepts learned in class and in the course pack, your chances of passing the mid-term and final exams will be rather remote.

If you miss the deadline for any quizzes, you will receive a zero grade. There will be no make up quiz regardless of your reason for missing it. The strict rule is because the due dates are provided to you with advance notice – plan ahead!

Exams:

The midterm (30%) and final exam (40%) are paper exams in-person in a physical classroom at the Camosun College's Interurban campus.

The midterm is approximately two (2) hours in length and the final exam is three (3) hours.

The only items allowed in an exam are pens or pencils, highlighters, erasers, water, non-noisy snacks and a student-prepared 8.5x11 reference sheet (midterm 1-sided; final exam 2-sided). Non-programmable/textual calculators are also allowed. Programmable/textual calculators are NOT allowed. Details regarding the reference sheet requirements and restrictions will be provided on D2L. The midterm and final exams are closed book. All cell phones must be turned off during the exam. Smart watches/glasses/devices of any kind are NOT allowed.

COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

Deadlines and exams. You must submit and complete your projects and quizzes and write mid-term and final exams on the due date or as announced. A grade of zero will be assigned to late submissions/non-attendance. Late submissions will not be reviewed. There are no make-up quizzes, projects or exams of any kind if you simply missed it or if you performed poorly on them.

EXAM DATES WILL NOT BE RESCHEDULED. Non-attendance on scheduled exam dates will result in a zero grade. Exceptions will be made only for medical reasons or extenuating circumstances. The students must submit in writing in advance with reasonable notice (i.e., at least one week prior). In accordance with the Camosun College's policy and at the instructor's discretion, the instructor may accept or reject the request for rescheduling the exam depending on the circumstances. Plan ahead!

If you are late to the mid-term or final exams while the exams are in progress, you will not be given extra time to complete the exam. To be clear - for example:

• if a 2-hour exam is scheduled to start at 8:30am and you arrive at 9:30am (i.e., 1 hour late), you will have 1 hour to complete the exam. If you arrive at 10:31am, that is considered non-attendance because you did not arrive while the exam was in progress.

Students registered through the <u>Centre for Accessible Learning (CAL)</u> should discuss timelines with their instructors at the beginning of each semester.

Medical notes must be dated, signed, and be written on letterhead or prescription paper imprinted with the physician's name and address. Notes are accepted from Physician (GP or medical specialist), Nurse Practitioner, Psychiatrist, Psychologist, Counsellor and Aboriginal Elder. Electronic notes will not be accepted.
