CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

A technique-based and hands-on course which examines three printmaking media: etching, woodblock such as mokuhanga and photo screen printing. Students will complete projects which might include mokuhanga, chine-collé, digital print or combinations of these processes. Emphasis is placed on an environmentally sustainable studio practice with the use of non-toxic materials.

Assignments will account for most of your course grade. Student course work will be assessed on each assignments ability to demonstrate; informed experimentation, process comprehension, and exploration of the concepts and processes introduced within Printmaking (as noted above). *Students should plan to meet with the instructor if there is any uncertainty or concern regarding assignment guidelines, results, or course standing.

This studio-based course requires students to work on aspects of their assignments in class to develop shared learning, creative community, and experimentation.
