CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

A technique-based and hands-on course which examines three printmaking media: etching, woodblock such as mokuhanga and photo screen printing. Students will complete projects which might include mokuhanga, chine-collé, digital print or combinations of these processes. Emphasis is placed on an environmentally sustainable studio practice with the use of non-toxic materials.

3. Develop and implement projects that illustrate individual concepts through the consideration of printmaking strategies.

4. To interpret and generate constructive and interculterally aware critiques of one's own and others' projects.

REQUIRED MATERIALS & RECOMMENDED PREPARATION / INFORMATION

You will be learning 3 printmaking processes in this course:

- 1. Screen Printing
- 2. Intaglio Etching
- 3. Relief Woodcut

Tools & Supplies Required for the Printmaking Processes

- Artist's apron or lab coat
- Sketchbook
- Basic drawing supplies pencils, coloured pencils, technical pens, erasers
- Large Ziplock Bags (to store gloves)
- Wood carving tools: Various options from Opus, Lee Valley, Canadian Tire.
- Precision knife/cutter such as stencil knife, or a scalpel blade
- Etching needle (or equivalent)

Optional Supplies:

- Small containers for ink storage
- Respirator for working with vapors
- Paintbrush (a few in varied sizes)
- Rags
