COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

This course emphasizes **Exploration, Innovation & Risk-Taking, Skills Acquisition & Overcoming Challenges, Formal Unity of Idea and Work,** and **Professionalism/Consistency/Achieving Original Goals**. Your work will be evaluated based on the **intensity** and **quality** of your effort.

Involvement:

- Active Participation: Engage in class critiques, discussions, and activities.
- **Time Commitment:** Dedicate 6 hours per week to in-class work and a minimum of 4 hours per week to independent study.

Quality:

- 1. **Conceptual Strength:** Demonstrate strong ideas through exploration, inventiveness, risk-taking, and rigorous research.
- 2. **Project Success:** Successfully translate your initial concept into a realized artwork, addressing evolving concerns.
- 3. **Aesthetic Excellence:** Produce work with strong formal qualities, demonstrating mastery of materials and presentation.
- 4. **Class Participation:** Actively participate in critiques and discussions, contribute constructively, and be prepared for class.
- 5. **Studio Conduct:** Maintain a professional and respectful studio environment.
- Studio Habits Grade: Starts at 10/10. Deductions will be applied for:
 - Unsafe or disrespectful use of studio facilities.
 - o Failure to clean up after yourself.
 - Leaving work in unauthorized areas (3% deduction per work).

Failure to properly store or dispose of projects by the end of the semester (5% deduction per work).

Key Principles:

- **Embrace Challenge:** Studio practice is a high-risk, high-reward endeavor.
- Professionalism: Conduct yourself as a professional artist in all aspects of your work.
- Consistency: Maintain a consistent work ethic and practice.
- Accountability: Regularly assess your progress and seek feedback from your instructor.
- **Documentation:** Thoroughly document your research and process through objects and presentations.
- Artist Statement: Prepare a concise and insightful artist statement.

Course Structure:

- **Independent Exploration:** You will explore a wide range of materials and media, developing your own artistic voice.
- Project Development: Complete at least one project or progress report per major critique¹.
- **Critiques:** Participate in two major group critiques and receive ongoing feedback from the instructor.
- Research & Development: Conduct thorough research, including reading, drawing, writing, modeling, and experimentation.
- **Presentation:** Learn to effectively present your work, considering lighting, placement, and site-specificity.

Note:

• **Research:** Broadly defined as active inquiry, including reading, drawing, writing, modeling, discussing, interviewing, and observing.

• **High-Value Work:** Characterized by originality, difficulty, and uniqueness.

Embrace risk and failure. Don't be afraid to experiment boldly and push the boundaries of your practice. Even if you encounter setbacks, learn from them and continue to explore. When feeling stuck, engage in a multitude of small, exploratory exercises. These "quick and dirty" studies can serve as valuable sketches or notations. Often, unexpected breakthroughs occur when you embrace the process and allow it to guide you.

Creativity demands time, commitment, and courage. Be patient, persistent, and fearless in your artistic endeavour.

¹ Expect to invest significant time in your work. For the first report, dedicate at least 16 hours. For each subsequent report, add a minimum of 10 additional hours. The quality of your work directly reflects the time and effort you invest. This will be evident in the depth of your research, the thoroughness of your experimentation, and the rigor of your creative process.
