CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Advanced structure and function of the musculoskeletal system with emphasis on the lower extremity. Focus is on anatomy vocabulary and palpation to investigate musculoskeletal system construction and the relationships between the bones, muscles, joints, ligaments, nerves and blood vessels with respect to performance, injury, disease and rehabilitation. Open to Athletic & Exercise Therapy students only.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Identify and palpate the origin, insertion, blood supply, nerve innervations, action, and describe the function of the muscles of the lower extremity.
- Identify and explain the attachments, and the function of all inert tissues that comprise each peripheral joint in the lower extremity and surrounding tissue.
- Demonstrate the ability to palpate and approximate all the muscle attachments and all bony projections, roughenings, or depressions on each bone of the lower extremity and the surrounding tissue.
- Demonstrate the ability to palpate and approximate selected landmarks in surface anatomy of the lower extremity.
- Demonstrate an understanding of lower extremity differences across populations.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the limits of the athletic/exercise therapists knowledge and how this can influence professional image.
