Lecture Attendance

Attending lectures will be an important part of succeeding in this course. From time to time there will be quizzes and other in-class activities for marks that will also help you and I determine how you are doing with the material. If you know that there is a lecture that you will miss where an announced activity will take place, you must let me know ahead of time and have a legitimate reason to miss it (e.g. an emergency or an illness with documented evidence). The lecture PowerPoint presentations will be posted on d2l but there will be much more information provided during lecture time that you won't want to miss!

Laboratory Attendance

The laboratory experience is critical to the course objectives and so attendance throughout the entire laboratory session is mandatory and will be noted. Lateness in arriving, failure to attend the lab or leaving the lab before its scheduled finish time will result in forfeiting credit for that lab, including any written assignments.

Arriving after the start of the lab time is considered late.

Missed Labs Guidelines:

- Students who will miss a laboratory session have an obligation to seek out concessions directly from their instructor in a timely manner, BEFORE the lab period occurs.
- If notification is provided AFTER the lab has occurred, concessions may not be available.
- If you miss up to three (3) laboratory sessions, you are still eligible to meet the Learning Outcomes for the course.
- Concessions offered for the first three (3) missed laboratory sessions will depend on the reason for laboratory absence and is up to instructor discretion. Concessions may include writing up the laboratory report with provided data, omitting the lab, or other concessions.
- If you miss **a total of four (4) or more labs for any reason** (including, but not limited to: life circumstances, legitimate illness or family/pet emergency, planned vacations, milestone family events, work commitments, childcare or eldercare commitments, competitive athletic events), you will be unable to meet the learning outcomes for the class and **will receive a failing grade (F) in the entire course**, regardless of marks received on graded lab and lecture components. . Exceptions will only be considered through an academic concession granted by the instructor or Dean/Associate Dean.
- This guideline applies to in-person laboratory activities only; for missed Lab Exams, please see the section in this outline on Exams below.

Missed Exams

Without exception, all lecture and lab exams must be written at the scheduled times. However, it is understood that emergency circumstances occur (e.g. severe illness or emergency in the immediate family); for such circumstances accommodation may be offered at the discretion of the instructor, provided the student: (a) notifies the instructor in advance of the exam (not after), and (b) provides documented evidence of the circumstance is applicable.

In the event of emergency circumstances, it is at the instructor's discretion whether to administer a make-up exam or adjust the weighting of the final exam to make up the missing marks. Note that work commitments or holiday travel are NOT considered emergency circumstances. Be sure not to make any travel plans for the end of the semester until the final exam schedules are finalized and posted.

Assignments

There will be many lecture and lab assignments throughout the course. It is the student's responsibility to be informed of any work expected and the dates the work is due. Some course assignments will be group work; most course assignments will be individual work. When submitting your own individual assignment, be sure that it is your own work (keeping in mind student conduct requirements). This applies even if you are working with a study group! I do encourage you to study and work with other students, but the work you submit must still be your own. For group assignments, each person in a group will receive the same mark on any group work. Please submit assignments in the format requested by the instructor. Incorrect formatting will result in late penalties and delayed grading.

Late Penalties

Assignments are due at the **beginning** of the class period on the due date. Assignments not handed in at the beginning of class will be considered late, for which there is a 10% penalty/day. The format is expected to be professional, i.e. a neat, legible, clean copy. "Rough" drafts risk rejection and a subsequent late penalty. If the assignment is more than one page, separate pages must be stapled before you come to class. Electronic submissions will not be accepted unless otherwise stated by the instructor.
