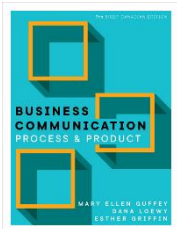

 - Identify, cite, and format reliable and credible sources for primary and secondary research using APA style

You may have the option to purchase this text bundled with an additional digital resource called *MindTap*. *MindTap* includes the e-text plus a range of useful resources such as videos, chapter reviews, self-quizzes, etc. Students are *not* required to purchase *MindTap*, but may find it a useful resource – particularly if you are already planning to use the e-text. Students who purchase *MindTap* will need a student registration URL and a “course key” to access the site. These will be provided by your instructor during the first week of class.

In general, the course will operate as follows:

- BUS 130-D01/D01IE will run from Mon May 2 – Sat Jun 18 in a fully online format, with no requirement for students to physically visit campus.
- Course week will run from Monday to Sunday, and will include a combination of live, video-conferenced lectures and optional “follow-up” meetings to address questions regarding weekly course content or clarification of assignment instructions.
- In general, the schedule of live online sessions will include:
 - **Mon/Wed @ 8:30am** – live lectures of weekly content (90-110 min; attendance required)
 - **Tue/Thu @ 8:30am** – live follow-up meetings (30-60 min; attendance optional unless otherwise noted)
- Quizzes and assignments will be due by 11:59pm each Sunday evening (unless otherwise noted). See schedule on p.4 of this outline for details.
- Course materials will be available on the course D2L site at <http://online.camosun.ca/> beginning Mon May 2. Lecture slides will typically be posted to D2L immediately prior to each lecture.
- All live lectures and follow-up meetings will be recorded, with recordings available to those students who wish to review, or who are unable to attend the live session.
- **Attendance at all required live lectures (i.e., every Mon/Wed plus some Tue/Thu) will be monitored and will count toward your final course grade.** Attendance at “follow-up” meetings is optional and attendance will not count toward final grade.
- There is no final exam for this course.

- Unless otherwise specified, all assignments should use 12-pt Times New Roman font.
- Grammar, spelling, style, and APA formatting of citations and references will be assessed in your mark.
- All secondary data incorporated into assignment submissions must be properly referenced to source(s).
- Unless otherwise specified, all assignment file names should begin with student's last name and be submitted to the appropriate D2L Assignments folder by the scheduled due date.

Assignment, quiz, and exam deadlines. All assignments must be submitted on or before the scheduled due date.
