CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

This course provides an introduction to information systems, hardware, software, networks and communication technologies as they are applied in a business context. Word processing, spreadsheet, presentation, and file management software will be introduced

- 7. Use introductory concepts of coding.
- 8. Use software up to an intermediate level for a variety of business applications including document production, spreadsheets, databases, and presentations and file management for local networked devices.

REQUIRED MATERIALS & RECOMMENDED PREPARATION / INFORMATION

Students who wish to do homework outside the college must have access to a computer capable of running the Microsoft Office suite (including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Access). A significant portion marks comes from the database (Access) component, and Access is not available for Macs. All practical exercises, assignments, and exams are done in Office 2021 under Windows 10. WORKLOAD

CLASSES

Assignments have very specific requirements, and are marked formally.

Exercises and assignments take various forms: in-class discussions, in-class exercises and assignments (both on paper and in specific software), and on-line in D2L. At various times, there will be both in-class and take-home exercises and assignments. Some assignments require a physical printout as part of the submission.
