CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Students will apply a number of statistical techniques used for business decision-making. They will learn to solve business problems and make related predictions using simple and multiple regressions, exponential smoothing, non-parametric statistical procedures, analysis of variance, seasonal and enumerative data, linear programming, and inventory control models.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Utilize appropriate tools to support quantitative problem solving.
- 2. Apply the F-distribution and the concept of analysis of variance (ANOVA) to compare the means of multiple populations and make inferences about the relative variances of two populations.
- 3. Develop simple and multiple linear regression models for analyzing cross-sectional data.
- 4. Apply the χ^2 distribution and non-parametric methods to hypothesis testing and the analysis of ranked data.
- 5. Use and explain concepts related to statistical quality control.
- 6. Construct and use indices to compare data.
- 7. Choose appropriate time series methods and use them to forecast in-sample and out-of-sample data.
