CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Students will examine the foundations of the Canadian legal system, including Indigenous law, and apply this knowledge to a range of business environments. Learners will obtain the theoretical and applied knowledge of basic legal principles as they pertain to business practices to ensure compliance with the law and reduce legal risk.

2. Apply the framework of the Canadian legal system, including Indigenous law, to a range of business environments, including accounting, management, marketing, and human resources.
3. Identify and describe current and emerging legal issues in the Canadian business environment in order to ensure compliance and manage risk.
4. Use appropriate resources to manage and minimize legal risks in the business environment.
5. Apply legal analyses to fact patterns related to contracts, torts and select areas of law.

EVALUATION OF LEARNING

a) **Exams** – 60% of total course marks as follows:

Students will write two (2) exams: a midterm exam and a final exam. Both exams are 100 minutes long and are open book*. Each exam is worth 30%. The midterm exam covers chapters 1-5 and Indigenous law and the final exam covers chapters 6-11 and Indigenous law (inclusive for both). The midterm exam is during class time on February 12. The final exam will be scheduled during the final exam period.

* Students are not allowed to use the Internet/smartphones during open book exams. Exams are invigilated and students must write all exams on Camosun computers.

b) **Quizzes**** – 20% of course marks as follows:

Students will complete up to 6 quizzes on following dates:

- Quiz #1 – January 15
- Quiz #2 – January 22
- Quiz #3 – March 5
- Quiz #4 – March 19
- Quiz #5 – March 26
- Quiz #6 – April 9

**Students only need to complete 4 of the 6 quizzes – only the four best marks will count in final grade calculation.

c) **Factual Analyses** – 20% of total course marks as follows:

Students will complete 4 factual analyses on the following dates:

- Factual Analysis #1 – January 29
- Factual Analysis #2 – February 5
- Factual Analysis #3 – March 12
- Factual Analysis #4 – April 2

Deadlines and exams

You must submit your assignments by the due date or as announced. A grade of zero will be assigned to late submissions. There are no additional assignments or make-up exams of any kind if you performed poorly on an assignment, midterm or final exam.

EXAM DATES WILL NOT BE RESCHEDULED. Non-attendance on scheduled exam dates will result in a zero grade. All exams must be written at the scheduled times with the exception of students requiring an accommodation by CAL. It is understood that emergency circumstances do occur (e.g. severe illness or family emergency); for such circumstances accommodation may be granted at the discretion of the instructor, provided the student:

- a) notifies the instructor *in advance* of the exam (not after), and
- b) provides documented evidence of the circumstance (e.g. medical certificate).

In most cases of an excused absence for an exam, an alternate exam will be scheduled for the student at the end of term.

Do not make travel plans until the final exam schedules are finalized and posted. Please ask any family members who might make travel plans on your behalf to consult you before booking tickets. Travel plans are not an acceptable reason to miss an exam.
