COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

Labs: The lab sessions are intended to give practical experience in the material covered in the lectures. These sessions provide an opportunity for you to discuss with the instructor your progress or problems in solving the lab assignments. You should have made some attempts or progress in the assignment before coming to lab session. Labs must be submitted prior to their due date.

Must achieve a minimum average of 55% on the labs. Late assignments and/or labs are subjected to a 5% penalty, except by the instructor's prior written permission or in the presence of a dire and documented short-term medical or family emergency.

Students throughout the semester must keep copies of all submitted labs. Labs must be submitted in the form of electronic by the due date.

Exams: Must achieve a minimum average 55% on the Final exam to pass the course.

Attendance: Students should attend the demo part of the lab sessions since materials covered and discussed will enhance or impede student's learning.
