Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Explain fundamental concepts applicable to economic problems.
- 2. Analyze and calculate the impact of market conditions and/or government policies on market equilibrium.
- 3. Calculate and interpret elasticity as a measure of the responsiveness of demand or supply to changes in income, the product's own price, and price of other products.
- 4. Apply consumer theory to determine optimal quantity of goods purchased
- 5. Calculate various cost measures; and identify the relationship between them.
- 6. Explain how efficiency is impacted by different market structures and how markets reach equilibrium.
- 7. Explain and analyze the role of comparative advantage in international trade and explain effects of different trade policies.
- 8. Apply microeconomic reasoning to explain current events.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Students are introduced to the principles of microeconomic analysis. They will learn how markets function and how changes in consumer preference, production technology, and resource availability affect the prices and quantities of goods.

Quizzes: You will get a quiz for each Chapters. You will get 3 attempts per quiz and the highest grade will be kept. Your 2 lowest quiz grades during the semester will be dropped.

Discussion Posts: You will get discussion posts during the semester. You will have to post your answers in the discussion board on D2L. For most of the discussion posts, you will not have to respond to other students.

Midterms and Final: There will be a midterm examination and a final examination for this class. The Final is cumulative.

Interview Examination: This evaluation will be a 10 to 15 minutes interview with your instructor twice during the semester. The instructor will provide you with a broad question in advance, and you will have to answer the question during the interview. If you answer the question incorrectly, the instructor will provide you with leading questions to guide you to the correct solution. If you arrive at the correct solution with help from your instructor by the end of the interview, you should get a grade of 60% on this evaluation. If you arrive at a correct solution by yourself, you should a higher grade.

Use of Generative AI: During this course, you are going to be required to complete several written assignments. Can you use AI to complete this!? Maybe! If you choose to use AI for one of your written assignments, you must DISCLOSE that you have used it and indicate which portion of the text was prepared by AI versus prepared by you. Within your report, you must include a discussion on WHY you used chat GPT, how it helped you, and what areas it left out. Did you make any edits to what it gave you? If I find that chat GPT has been used and not disclosed, even when permitted, academic integrity penalties will be applied. AI is not appropriate in response to debrief questions or reflections on self-learning and cannot be used in exams.
