PREREQUISITE(S): A grade of "C" in Principles of Math 11 or Applications of Math 12 or a "C+" in Math072. In addition, it is expected that students are familiar with the operation of their calculators, and that they will participate in course activities and stay current with their homework.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Calculate the time-value of money and use this information to solve for unknown payments, final payments and equivalent payment streams.

2. Use both simple and compound interest to calculate interest rate, maturity value, present value and time to maturity for items such as credit cards, student loans, treasury bills, commercial paper and promissory notes.

3. Convert between different nominal interest rates to compare investments.

4. Distinguish among several types of annuities and choose the appropriate formula to solve business-related word problems, such as, retirement planning, mortgage calculations, amortization, personal credit repayments and refinancing.

5. Describe bonds and calculate bond purchase prices, bond market quotes and yield to maturity to make sound investment decisions.

6. Choose between sinking funds or amortization to calculate loan repayment schedules.

7. Use net present value and internal rate of return to determine the most profitable course of action among alternatives.
