COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

This course is an introduction to Canadian investment and capital markets. Topics will include the analysis of financial statements and other published data, the role of an investment dealer and a study of investment instruments: equities, options, rights, warrants and mutual funds.

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Identify the role and activities of market participants to understand how a market functions.
- 2. Differentiate, explain, and calculate the different types of financial instruments, including derivatives, in the context of financial decision-making.
- 3. Interpret financial statements and indices to make investment decisions.
- 4. Understand and explain the impact of monetary policy on different investment decisions.
- 5. Evaluate the impact of risk on investment decisions.

6. Function in a responsible and accountable manner respecting the legal, ethical, and social parameters of the finance environment.
