CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) encompass a powerful set of tools that can be used to find solutions to a vast range of problems in Geography and other disciplines. Building on their previous GIS knowledge, students will further hone and grow these skills as they critically analyze how to best apply them to real-world situations. Students will apply concepts of spatial data models and spatial analysis to propose comprehensive solutions to case studies, which they will document in written reports. Through applied projects, students will access spatial data from a variety of sources, including Traditional Ecological Knowledge, and also be asked to collect their own spatial data.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

This course builds on the GIS foundations developed in GEOG 217 and allows students to become proficient enough to work in the field upon course completion. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

Identify the relevant spatial data and methods of spatial analysis needed to provide solutions to real-world case studies across diverse disciplines.

Work with spatial data to:

Acquire and store data from different sources.

Identify advantages and disadvantages of certain data formats.

Manipulate and analyze data using current GIS software and methods of spatial analysis.

Draw conclusions from their analyses and present these in report form.
