Course Description: Students will study adapted sport and physical activity for individuals living with sensory, intellectual and/or physical impairment. Students will study the social construction of disability, assumptions regarding disability, as well as the concepts of accessibility, integration, and inclusion. Students will also be introduced to strategies to adapt and modify activities to meet individual participant needs.

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COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

Exams: Students should avoid making prior travel, employment, or other commitments for this period. In consultation with the instructor, any student who was unable to attend a lab/practical session may be required to perform a make-up assignment or attend a make-up session. This consultation must occur within 1 week of the excused absence.

Professional standards for students

Exam and Assignment Scheduling Policy: The course exams and assignments are pre-scheduled by the instructor and written or due as outlined in this course outline.

Late Assignments/Class Absences: I will handle late submissions on a case-by-case basis. In other words, I will hear your case but if you have a lame excuse don't expect much grace. The earlier you communicate the situation that is causing you to be absent or not submit an assignment on time, the better off you will be. I.e. If an assignment is due on Sunday night, a students who suddenly remembers on Friday night that they have a tournament that weekend is unlikely to get a break on marking.
