CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

In this introductory course, students will focus on modern Korean with an emphasis on colloquial, spoken language. Students with no or little knowledge of Korean will develop a solid foundation in the Hangeul script, pronunciation, core vocabulary and basic sentence patterns that are essential to basic communications. Students will learn the cultural conventions for appropriate language use.

COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

KORE 100 is university transferrable to other institutions in BC. For example, KORE 100 is equivalent to PAAS 128 at University of Victoria.

Attendance & Participation: Prompt arrival, attendance, and active participation in class is essential to your success in the course. We will use every minute of our time together so being on time is important, both out of respect to your peers and for the tasks we will undertake together. During class, you will have the opportunity to develop your speaking and listening skills through instructor-guided activities. This includes speaking regularly in class, actively listening to your classmates, and speaking often in small groups. The exercises we practice together will help build your new language skills, reduce anxiety, and increase your confidence to complete graded assessments in the course. You are also expected to be attentive and respectful in class. Student participation will be monitored in each class and distracting, or disrespectful

behaviors will be noted and will result in point deductions. If you are having difficulty attending class for any reason or if you are anxious about speaking in class, please let me know so that we can work together to find a solution.

Workbook & Textbook Exercises: The purpose of these assignments is to reinforce your understanding of the grammar features and vocabulary studied in class. Each workbook assignment is due before the next class. You are expected to complete the assigned page(s) independently and then use a different color pen to self-correct your answers using the provided answer key. A full mark will be given for sincere completion and neat presentation including accurate self-corrections. A partial mark will be given for missing sections or if the assignment was submitted without self-corrections. If the assignment is completed but submitted after the due date, a half mark will be given. Due dates for textbook assignments will be announced and posted on D2L.

D2L Self-Assessments: A self-assessment will be posted on D2L after completing each lesson. The purpose of this assignment is to provide you with an opportunity to evaluate your understanding of the content you are learning in class, such as grammar, its usage, vocabulary, and more. This self-assessment will help you identify areas where you need to improve. To maximize your learning, thoroughly review the course materials (class PPTs, textbook, workbook, study notes) before starting the assessment. You can refer to these resources if you are having difficulties answering questions. Your grade will be based on sincere effort, thorough completion, and demonstrated practice to improve your understanding of the class content. If it is determined that the self-assessment was not completed with honest effort, a partial score may be given based on the quality of the submission. Students will have two attempts to complete each self-assessment. After the second attempt, the answer key and your score will be provided. Further details will be discussed in class.

Role Plays: There will be two role plays. For each assignment, a script will be provided on D2L. You may modify the script where indicated to reflect your own situation or interests. You are required to memorize your lines and perform the role play. The performance must be video recorded and submitted. The marking criteria for this assignment are available on D2L.

Video Presentation: For this assignment, you will write a script about a given topic and make a video presentation. This assignment provides you with the opportunity to demonstrate what you learned during the semester. You are required to submit a script for feedback. After receiving feedback, revise the script and then submit a video recording with a final script. Evidence of using any translators will result in a zero on the assignment. Details will be discussed in class.

Quizzes: There will be Hangeul quizzes and lesson quizzes to facilitate understanding of the Korean language taught in class. The Hangeul quiz will include identifying target Hangeul sounds and writing basic words. Lesson quizzes will include vocabulary, grammar features, and listening comprehension etc. Students will have an opportunity to practice and ask questions in the classes before completing a quiz.

Due Dates and Late Assignments: It is expected that students will hand in assignments on time. The due dates are established in accordance with the course and term duration. The purpose of the due dates is to help both you and I to get the assignments done so that they can be assessed in a timely manner (unless you have an approved academic accommodation through CAL). Late assignments may be graded but won't get feedback. Late assignments will not be accepted after 3 days, including weekends. After the last day of class, late assignments won't be accepted without prior consent.

Make-Up for missed quizzes is available due to illness or accident. Please notify me before the due date to make an alternative arrangement.

Typing in Korean: It is important to learn to write in Korean and it is also very useful to learn typing in Korean as most modern communication is done through typing these days (e.g., email and chatting). Some of the classwork can be done by typing.

Study Attitudes: For learning a new language, it is important to practice the target language regularly as often as you can to store it in long-term memory. Cramming right before the quiz usually results in quickly forgetting it again. Throughout the semester, you will have lots of opportunities to apply what you learned to make some short conversations and practice your speaking. Most of the marking is based on your sincere effort and completion. In other words, there is no place for using any kind of translator for the assignments. It is obvious if a translator is used. In that case, you not only lose marks for the assignment but also lose the opportunity to learn. As you are a beginner, what you want to say is very limited, but you will learn to communicate within our class level. After each assignment is submitted, I will try to give feedback as soon as possible, hoping that you will learn from the feedback. If you need any clarification or help, please contact me as soon as possible. I am here to work with you and help you succeed. That is the purpose of office hours. Please take full advantage of this opportunity to contact and ask me any questions you may have. Learning a new language takes time and practice, but it can be very rewarding. It is important to stay motivated and continue learning. I hope to see you succeed in learning Korean.
