COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

KORE 101 is university transferrable to other institutions in BC. For example, KORE 101 is equivalent to PAAS 129 at University of Victoria.

Attendance & Participation: Prompt arrival, attendance, and active participation in class is essential to your success in the course. We will use every minute of our time together so being on time is important, both out of respect to your peers and for the tasks we will undertake together. During class, you will have the opportunity to develop your speaking and listening skills through instructor-guided activities. This includes speaking regularly in class, actively listening to your classmates, and speaking often in small groups. The exercises we practice together will help build your new language skills, reduce anxiety, and increase your confidence to complete graded assessments in the course. You are also expected to be attentive and respectful in class.

Workbook & Textbook Exercises: The purpose of this assignment is to reinforce learning of grammar features that you will study in class and to expand vocabulary. Each lesson's assignment due date is on Fridays at 11:59pm. You will complete the assigned exercises on your own and then use a different color pen to correct your answers with the answer key. A full mark will be given for a sincere completion/presentation and a partial mark will be given if there is a missing section or if it was submitted without self-corrections. If the assignment is complete but submitted after the due date, a half mark will be given.

Video Presentations: There will be (1) interview and (2) narration. For the interview, you will write interview questions and possible answers based on the class content and submit a script for feedback. After receiving feedback, revise the script and then submit a video recording with a final script. The video recording can be done individually or in pairs. For the narration, you will write a script about a given topic and make a video presentation. It is an opportunity to demonstrate what you learned in class. Evidence of using any translators will result in a zero on the assignment. Details will be discussed in class.

Sentence Building Exercises: After each lesson you will have an opportunity to practice your writing to review the class content. You will also have an opportunity to create your own sentences based on given examples and have opportunities to correct any errors after receiving feedback. If I request to resubmit the improved version, but it is not submitted, a half score will be given. For late submissions, a partial score may be given depending on the quality of sentences. Evidence of using any translators will result in a zero on the assignment. Details will be discussed in class.

Quizzes: The goal of these quizzes is to facilitate understanding of the Korean language taught through each lesson. Lesson quizzes will include vocabulary, grammar features, and listening comprehension etc. Students will have an opportunity to practice and ask questions in the classes before completing a quiz.

Make-Up for missed quizzes is available due to your illness or accident, etc., please notify the instructor before the due date to make an alternative arrangement.

Due Dates and Late Assignments: It is expected that students will hand in assignments on time. The due dates are established in accordance with the course and term duration. The purpose of the due dates is to help both you and I to get the assignments done so that they can be assessed in a timely manner (unless you have an approved academic accommodation through CAL). Late assignments may be graded but won't get feedback. Assignments will not be accepted that are late more than 3 days, inclusive of days over the weekend. After the last day of class, late assignments won't be accepted without prior consent.

Study Attitudes: For language learning, it is important to practice the target language regularly as often as you can to store it in long-term memory. Cramming right before the quiz usually results in quickly forgetting it again. Throughout the semester, you will have lots of opportunities to apply what you learned to make your own sentences and practice your speaking. Most of the marking is based on your sincere effort and completion. In other words, there is no place for any kinds of translators for the assignments. It is so obvious if

a translator is used. In that case, you not only lose marks for the assignment but also forgo the opportunity to learn. As you are a beginner, what you want to say is very limited, but you will learn to communicate within our class level. After each assignment is submitted, I will try to give feedback as soon as possible, hoping that you will learn from the feedback. If you need any clarification or help, please contact me as soon as possible. I am happy to work with you. That is the purpose of office hours. Take full advantage of contacting your instructor. Acquiring another language takes time and practice and there will be ups and downs on your journey to achieve the goal. It is important to stay motivated and keep learning. It will be a pleasure to see you succeed in learning Korean.
