CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Restricted to students in Massage Therapy

Students will study cellular biology and histology and be introduced to the fundamental principles of systemic anatomy and physiology as they relate to homeostasis, with a focus on the integumentary system. Students will gain foundational knowledge of how structure and function relate to the pathology of commonly occurring conditions and impairments relevant to massage therapy.

PREREQUISITE(S): CO-REQUISITE(S): EXCLUSION(S): At the completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Define and describe levels of structural organization and anatomical terminology of the human body.
- Demonstrate knowledge of fluid, electrolyte, and acid-base homeostasis as it relates to clinical conditions of fluid balance.
- Define and describe the types and histological features of the major body tissue types, including epithelial, connective, nervous, and muscle tissue.
- Demonstrate knowledge of principles of cellular anatomy and physiology as it relates to the body tissues.
