CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Course is restricted to students in the Massage Therapy program.

Students will be introduced to manual applications of massage therapy. Students will study the physiological effects, indications, and safety considerations for various Swedish massage techniques. Students will develop their palpation skills and learn proper biomechanics, hygiene practices, patient handling, and draping techniques in massage therapy.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of indications, safety considerations, effects, and outcomes of various Swedish massage techniques used for relaxation.
- Apply and modify various Swedish massage techniques into treatment based on patient/client history, presentation, and response.
- Utilize standard hygiene practices and apply standard precautions for infection control.
- Identify common biomechanical and postural risks for massage therapists.
- Apply biomechanical and postural skills to preserve therapist health.
- Drape/undrape patients appropriately for treatment.
- Conduct oneself professionally by maintaining appropriate grooming, dress, and hygiene.
- Identify the origins of the practice of using touch as a healing method in historical practice and the general differences between Eastern and Western massage philosophies.

COURSE GUIDELINES & EXPECATIONS

Students are expected to attend lectures prepared to discuss materials from related readings. There will be several assignments throughout the course. It is the student's responsibility to be informed of any assigned work and due dates. Late assignments are not accepted. Extensions will be granted if they are submitted PRIOR to the deadline.

In-class performance is crucial for success in this course and program. Though attendance itself is not graded, activities and assignments completed in class are. Missing class means you forfeit the mark for that activity. No make-up opportunities will be available for these in-class activities. However, you may discard your 2 lowest graded assignments. If you miss class and receive 0 for these assignments, they can count as your "throw-away" grades. Some assignments may be self-graded by students. Your learning is your responsibility and the grade you give yourself is the most reflective of how you are doing.

Students participate in role-playing activities to practice skills on each other. While learning to do assessments and treatments, students will palpate and treat other students on a regular basis. Students will maintain optimum levels of safe behavior (personal hygiene, decontamination of personal and class equipment to minimise potential for disease transmission and use of proper body mechanics). Students must come appropriately dressed to allow for hands on application / demonstration of assessment and treatment techniques.

SCHOOL OR DEPARTMENTAL INFORMATION

The Diploma in Massage Therapy prepares graduates to become independent, successful, and professional health care providers in the area of massage therapy. The program includes advanced theoretical knowledge and the practical application of the skills necessary to provide safe, effective, and ethical massage therapy that meets entry to practice requirements of the College of Massage Therapists of BC. Students learn to apply principles of physical, health, and social sciences as they relate to massage therapy in the classroom, simulated environments, and through clinical placements in the community.
