Students study the peripheral divisions of the nervous system with a focus on spinal and cranial nerves.

Specific innervations which affect musculoskeletal health will be explored and assessed.

- Describe the nerves of the posterior primary divisions of C1-8
- Describe the nerves of the anterior primary division of the cervical plexus
- Describe the roots, trunks, divisions, cords and branches of the brachial plexus
- Describe the anatomy of the intercostal nerves
- Describe the roots and nerves of the lumbar plexus
- Describe the roots and branches of the sacral and coccygeal plexuses.
- Assess the dermatomes of the upper, lower limbs, and trunk and its significance to neurological

conditions

- Describe the cranial nerves including name, number, course and innervation (motor/sensory)
- Test each cranial nerve and explain the significance of each
- Integrate knowledge of the anatomy of spinal and cranial nerves to inform assessment
