CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Designed for prospective elementary school teachers, this course provides students with a solid grounding in fundamental mathematical methods and concepts with which to teach math at an elementary school level. Topics include: reasoning about quantities, numeration systems and their properties, numerical operations with applications, mental computation and estimation, meaning for fractions and computing with fractions, multiplicative comparisons and reasoning, the set of real numbers and its subsets, elementary number theory, and basic algebra.

Upon completion of this course a student will be able to:

Give examples of the role quantities play in our lives and how quantities are expressed.

Explain how to add, subtract and convert values in different bases

Explain children's ways of adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing.

Perform mental computation and computational estimation in a variety of ways.

Interpret the meaning of fraction symbol, and compute with fractions.

Define and recognize rational numbers, irrational numbers, real numbers, and operations with them.

Use ratios, proportions, and percentages to solve a variety of problems.

Find prime numbers less than a given number, find the prime factorization of a number, and use divisibility tests to determine whether a number is prime.

Find greatest common factor and least common multiples of sets of numbers.

Solve problems involving basic algebra, arithmetic and geometric sequences.

Explain mathematical concepts at an elementary school level.
