CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Students will be introduced to the concepts of automation, as they apply to production plants and assembly processes. Sensors, controllers, actuators, materials, power-transmission systems, computer hardware and computer software will be examined. Basic principles of robotics will be considered.

- 7. Identify automation support systems including: materials handling, storage & retrieval, inspection & testing, identification & tracking
