Student-led ensembles work independently and under the guidance of weekly professional coaching. Students perform one or more concert, service, or workshop performances per term. Repertoire is selected according to class instrumentation and availability of specialist coach. Contemporary combo, classical chamber, and collaborative ensemble options are offered.
