In this course students learn to harness cutting-edge digital instrumentation software to simulate acoustic performance with digital sequenced music. Musical Instrument Digital Interface (MIDI) technologies and software will be explored.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, a student will be able to:

1. Simulate acoustic performances of music using software instruments in such a way that a practitioner of acoustic instruments would accept the virtual performance as representative of acoustic capabilities and expression.

2. Produce moderately complex musical examples for digital performance through essential virtual and software instruments.
3. Arrange a moderately complex musical example for alternate instruments and render the example for digital performance to indicate an understanding of appropriate instrumental use in non-traditional musical settings.
4. Create and capture unique virtual and software instruments or sounds and employ a selection of these in an original digital performance.
5. Discuss the attributes of a variety of virtual and software instruments in their application to professional and academic settings.

REQUIRED MATERIALS & RECOMMENDED PREPARATION / INFORMATION

TEXTS: D2L contains all course texts or provides links to sites with the relevant materials.

OTHER: Computer (Mac or PC), Audio/MIDI interface, MIDI/USB keyboard controller, loudspeakers or headphones, Reaper or other DAW (software), Orchestral sample library comparable to Vienna Symphonic Library (VSL) Special Edition Volume 1 (e.g., MUSIO, EastWest Composer Cloud). The video examples use the VSL Special Edition, but concepts can be applied to other professional libraries. Please contact your instructor to check whether your chosen library meets the minimum requirements to be used in this course.
