CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

In this class students will learn fundamental skills of digital audio mixing and editing of recorded music using current software. A full range of post-recording aspects of production from raw data to produced delivery format will be explored. Focus will be on audio production for personal and light-commercial use.

Upon completion of this course, a student will be able to:

1. Perform basic mixing techniques on recorded digital audio material to produce a recording appropriate for portfolio presentation.

- 2. Apply basic techniques of music editing in the production of an audio recording appropriate for portfolio presentation.
- 3. Apply signal processing such as equalization, compression, and reverberation in the production of a finished recording appropriate for portfolio presentation.
- 4. Complete the process of producing and delivering a basic audio recording in a contemporary delivery format.
- 5. Discuss the attributes and applications of a variety of digital audio mixing and editing software programs in their application to professional and academic settings.

Technical Ear Training: In addition to practical exercises and quizzes, technical ear training is an essential part of the course. To develop technical listening skills, you are required to practice with the introduced software modules on a regular basis and complete all listening quizzes. Please note that listening skills develop over time, so the more regular your practice, the greater your progress.

Deadlines: You are expected to complete each module and submit the assignments by the stated deadline to receive full credit. Late submissions will be accepted with a late penalty. Please try to submit all assignments on time as the assignments progress in complexity and build upon each other. If you have any questions or problems with any of the assignments, please contact your instructor as soon as possible.
