EVALUATION OF LEARNING

DESCRIPTION	WEIGHTING
2 Short Assignments: There will be two exercises to be completed within class with the purpose of practicing the skills and applying ideas of the course. In a supportive and safe learning environment, students will have the opportunity to work in pairs and/or groups of three. The first assignment is worth 10% and the second assignment will be worth 15%.	25%
Group Presentation: In teams of 3 to 4 students, groups will have the opportunity to select a topic of interest in counselling to share with the class. Presentation details will be discussed in class and guidelines will be provided on the course site.	20%
Quizzes: There will be 3 quizzes corresponding to information from the class, readings, and student presentations. Each quiz will be worth 15%. Quizzes will be multiple choice and short answer style questions.	45%
Participation: Participation will be evaluated based on class attendance and quality of meaningful contributions in class. The quality, not quantity, of students' contributions is essential for participation. Quality contributions might look like offering thoughtful comments on issues and theory, asking questions that move the discussion forwards, as well as building on the comments of others. At times, students will be asked to complete short written activities related to lecture material. Active participation in the classroom exercises	10%

<p>and discussions allows for learning on an experiential level as well as a cognitive level, thus facilitating the ability to apply learning in one's personal and professional life. It is expected that students will participate actively, helpfully, with sensitivity, and will contribute to the safe and supportive learning environment of oneself and others. Students are expected to attend at least 80% of the class to receive full marks.</p>
