COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students will explore sport and fitness related legal issues and concepts. Students will be introduced to key areas of law that affect the sport and fitness environment and will address many of the strategies and techniques that would help the sport and fitness manager, and sport organization, avoid legal liability. Students will cover areas of negligence and liability, risk management, work relationships, violence, human rights and agency.

USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI)

Students are encouraged to embrace technology responsibly in their learning. Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools, such as ChatGPT or similar platforms, may be used for specific course tasks if explicitly approved by the instructor. However, the following guidelines must be observed:

- 1. **Permitted Use**: Al tools may assist in generating ideas, drafting outlines, or facilitating research, but students must actively engage with course content and ensure their submissions reflect their own understanding and critical thinking.
- 2. **Prohibited Use**: AI-generated content is not allowed for in-class reflections, oral defenses, or any tasks where personal analysis, ethical reasoning, or course-specific learning outcomes are assessed.
- 3. **Transparency**: If AI tools are used for permitted purposes, students must disclose this in their submission. For example, include a note stating: "AI was used to assist with [specific task]."
- 4. **Retention of AI Prompts and Outputs**: Students must keep a record (transcript) of all prompts and AIgenerated outputs used during their work. This transcript must be attached to the assignment submission for review.

- 5. **Originality**: All submitted work must demonstrate originality and align with the course's academic integrity standards. Plagiarism or over-reliance on Al-generated content is strictly prohibited and may result in academic penalties.
- 6. **Evaluation Criteria**: Assignments and projects will be assessed on the depth of analysis, originality, integration of course materials, and adherence to assignment guidelines, regardless of AI usage.
- 7. **Instructor's Discretion**: The instructor reserves the right to request clarification or additional explanations about a student's work to verify understanding and ensure compliance with these guidelines.

SCHOOL OR DEPARTMENTAL INFORMATION

Final examinations may be scheduled at any time during the examination period by Camosun College. All students are expected to write the final exam at the time, date, and location set by the Office of the Registrar. Students should therefore avoid making prior travel, employment, or other commitments for this period. If a student is unable to write an exam through no fault of his or her own for medical or other reason(s), valid documentation must be provided, and it must be discussed with the instructor well in advance of the exam date.
