**Description of Program:** This is a program with ESL support for students in the Health Care Assistant Program within the Continuing Care Department of Camosun College. In the ESL class, students will study new vocabulary, read and discuss the text and learning guides in preparation for classes given by HCA instructors, review for quizzes, and practise English skills. There will be a special emphasis on speaking and communication skills throughout the program. The intended outcome is that these ESL students will receive the Camosun Health Care Assistant Certificate.

In addition, there will be ongoing classroom assessment of English tasks that have been successfully accomplished, demonstrating language competencies in listening/speaking, reading, and writing, according to the ESL Learning Outcomes for this course.
