Description of Program: This is a program with ESL support for students in the Health Care Assistant Program within the Continuing Care Department of Camosun College. In the ESL class, students will study new vocabulary, read and discuss the text and learning guides in preparation for classes given by HCA instructors, review for quizzes, and practise English skills. There will be a special emphasis on speaking and communication skills throughout the program. The intended outcome is that these ESL students will receive the Camosun Health Care Assistant Certificate.

Evaluation: Each course will be evaluated according to the procedure described in the HCA Student Learning Guides. There will be quizzes, skill checks, case studies, presentations, and practicum checklists. **Students must achieve a minimum 70% average in classroom courses in order to progress to the final practicum, HCA 173 – Clinical Placement 3. Practicum courses are pass/fail.**

In addition, there will be ongoing classroom assessment of English tasks that have been successfully accomplished, demonstrating language competencies in listening/speaking, reading, and writing, according to the ESL Learning Outcomes for this course.
