<u>Description of Program:</u> This is a program with ESL support for students in the Health Care Assistant Program within the Continuing Care Department of Camosun College. Students must achieve a minimum 70% average in classroom courses in order to progress to the final practicum, HCA 173 – Clinical Placement 3. Practicum courses are pass/fail.

In addition, there will be ongoing classroom assessment of English tasks that have been successfully accomplished, demonstrating language competencies in listening/speaking, reading, and writing, according to the ESL Learning Outcomes for this course.

Upon successful completion of the ESL portion of the ESLHCA Combined Skills program, the learner will be able to use the English language to:

- 1. Communicate effectively with individuals or groups within community and institutional health care settings.
- 2. Demonstrate understanding of key information and instructions within community and health care settings.
- 3. Read and comprehend information relevant to the HCA role.
- 4. Convey information in writing in a clear, coherent manner.
- 5. Demonstrate an understanding of Canadian culture as related to HCA work requirements.
