Course Description

Fundamental Computer Studies will help students gain the confidence to perform basic computer operations. This course will also help them gain the computer and Internet and word processing skills they need to work in both traditional and online classroom.

2. Intended Learning Outcomes

- 1. Keyboarding
 - i. Use correct touch typing techniques and procedures for letters but not for top row numbers/symbols
 - ii. Demonstrate proper ergonomics
 - iii. Achieve an adjusted typing speed of 10 wpm
- 2. Basic Knowledge of Computers
 - i. List the basic parts of a computer system (system unit, monitor, keyboard, mouse, floppy disk drive, hard disk drive and printer)
 - ii. Demonstrate the ability to properly start and shut down a computer system
 - iii. Demonstrate the ability to start and close a program
 - iv. Describe a diskette and its care and limitations
 - v. Describe some common uses of computers in society
 - vi. Use a mouse
- vii. Demonstrate the ability to operate a printer (power on, put on line/off line and load paper)
- 3. Word Processing
 - i. Create a new word processing document
 - ii. Edit a document
 - iii. Save a document to a disk
 - iv. Print a document
 - v. Retrieve a document from a disk
 - vi. Use tools such as a spell checker or thesaurus
- 4. Electronic Communication
 - i. Browse the Internet
 - ii. Send and receive email
