**Course Description**

This course prepares intermediate and advanced level non-native speakers for the IELTS Exam, which is an internationally recognized as a preferred English Language requirement for educational, professional and immigration related purposes. Students will develop and practice test-taking strategies and the language skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking that will be encountered in the IELTS Exam. This course will give students:

- a good understanding of the IELTS test format
- practice in the 4 parts (Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking) of the test
- a full mock (practice) test under exam conditions
- individual feedback

**Intended Learning Outcomes**

In preparation for taking the IELTS exams, students will:

- Demonstrate understanding of time management and test-taking strategies
- Assess own strengths and weaknesses in order to continue to learn outside the classroom
- Demonstrate skills for isolating the correct answer in listening and reading
- Demonstrate the ability to express opinions and elaborate on answers in oral discourse
- Organize ideas in writing and provide relevant support for these ideas

In addition to the class hours, 1 computer lab hour each week will be provided for students to work **independently** on IELTS preparation exercises assigned by the instructor.
