2. Intended Learning Outcomes

- The student will be able to:
- grow own food
- identify different soil types and use organic amendments required for a healthy garden
- create and use composts and mulches effectively
- use and preserve water for optimal garden health
- identify different vegetables and select fruits
- choose the right vegetables for a garden
- create a vegetable garden
- demonstrate the proper cultivation for healthy vegetables and ornamental plants
- demonstrate how to care for vegetables using organic methods and practices
- demonstrate how to sow, plant, harvest and store vegetables
- propagate plants from seed, division and softwood, semi-hardwood and hardwood cuttings
- utilize different "covers" such as greenhouses, cold frames and cloches and plastic sheeting
- identify select native plants that have been used traditionally by the First Nations people of Southern Vancouver Island
- use holistic methods to work with pests and diseases which affect plant health
- select and utilize garden tools in safe and appropriate ways
- preserve and dry foods using traditional and contemporary methods
- apply effective communication and interpersonal skills to work as a group in a greenhouse/garden environment

3. Required Materials

Clothing that would suitable for work in garden and greenhouse setting, including steel-toed boots.

4. Course Content

This course deals with the specifics of local, sustainable plant production. Students will study soils, pest control, plant and fruit propagation, food plants, native plants, composting, pruning, garden design, use of green houses and cold frames, waterless gardening, companion gardening, winter gardens and traditional and contemporary methods for preserving and drying foods.

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

Students will be assessed by their:

- participation in class
- participation in group activities
- motivation to learn
- completion of assignments and projects
- application of knowledge from the classroom to garden, greenhouse and practicum sites.
