- 1. Respect the circle process as a critical component of the IFS program.
- 2. Participate regularly in circle discussions.
- 3. Provide contributions to circle discussions in a manner that contributes to the learning and development of all those involved.
- 4. Engage with Elders and Knowledge keepers.

Course Content:

- Explore Aboriginal ways of knowing
- Examine strengths within the program content
- Discuss individual journeys
- Experience oral tradition
- Explore the importance of community and land
- Discuss best practice
