5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

(a) Assignment - 15% of the course grade

Each student will be required to write a short essay which focuses on a topic related to the geography of Canada. Topics and format will be explained in class. **The essay will be due on Wednesday November 13**th.

(b) Mid-Term Exam - 25% of the course grade

The mid-term exam will cover the material up to the end of "Atlantic Canada". The exam will contain a mix of question types. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class.

(c) Final Exam - 30% of the course grade

The final exam will cover the material beginning with "Quebec" to the end of the course. The exam will contain a mix of question types. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class.

(d) Exercises - 30% of the course grade

There are six exercises in the course. The exercises vary in type. The date for each exercise is shown in the course schedule. Due date for each exercise will be identified at the time of the exercise. Late exercises, unless accompanied with a doctor's note, will be penalized at a rate of 10% per day and after the fifth day will not be accepted.
