5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

(a) Exercises - 20% of the course grade

There are five exercises in the course. The exercises vary in type. The date for each exercise is shown in the course schedule. Due date for each exercise is identified in schedule as well. Late exercises, unless accompanied with a doctor's note, will be penalized at a rate of 10% per day and after the fifth day will not be accepted.

(b) Mid Term Exam - 25% of the course grade

The mid term exam will cover the material up to the end of "Cultural Regions" The exam will contain a mix of question type. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class.

(c) Final Exam - **30% of the course grade**

The final exam will cover the material beginning with "Cultural Ecology" to the end of the course. The exam will contain a mix of question type. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class.

(d) Term Assignment - 25% of the course grade

Each student will select one of the options for the term assignment. The options will provide a unique but meaningful approach to learning cultural geography. The options will be discussed in detail in a seminar, the date of which is listed in the course schedule. The assignment is due on Wednesday November 27th. Late assignments will have 15% deducted from the given grade.
