## Course Description:

Chinese 101 is a sequel to Chinese 100. The course is designed to broaden students' fundamental linguistic skills in Chinese based on the language skills acquired in Chinese 100. Approximately 200 additional expressions will be learned. At this level, students are expected to read and write both Pin Yin and characters. The instructor will use more Chinese in class to maximize students' exposure to the Chinese language.

# Assignments:

Students should commit themselves to daily practice on Chinese characters, do the homework exercises in the exercise books and complete oral and written assignments assigned by the instructor at the end of each class. All assignments are expected to be completed on time.

#### Oral Presentation:

Each student will make one speech presentation in Chinese which can be in dialogue form with a partner ( about 15 Min. in length ). The oral presentation date for each student will be set in the middle of the semester. Speech outline in Chinese should be submitted to the instructor prior to the presentation.

#### Examination:

A quiz will be given upon completion of each lesson. There will be a midterm exam and a final exam. The specific date for each exam will be notified in advance.

Attendance in daily classes and the lab. session is important for this course. All tests will be given on the set dates, make-up tests will only be arranged in case of illness or emergencies.
