Course Objectives

This course is a general introduction to the science of psychology. The aim is to take a bird's eye view of the various fields of psychology such as brain & behavior, sensation & perception, learning, memory, language, and intelligence. While exploring these fields, challenges involved in psychological research are also examined.

Course Organization

Each week there will be a 2-hour lecture with the whole class and a 2-hour laboratory participation in small groups.

Lectures

- ♦ In my lectures, I will cover <u>some</u> material from the textbook, but I will also bring in **additional material** from other sources. Your **attendance at lectures** and **taking lecture notes** is therefore highly recommended.
- ♦ **Should you miss a lecture**, you should make sure that you get the lecture notes from a classmate. Or, have someone audio-tape the lecture for you. (You can borrow an audio-cassette player from the library)

Labs

- ♦ Labs will have a variety of activities and in-lab assignments.
- ♦ Your attendance in labs is mandatory.

Evaluation

- ♦ Exams (50%)
 - ❖ Midterm (25%) and a Final Exam (25%).

These will have 60-80 multiple choice questions and 2-4 short-essay questions covering material from the textbook, lectures, WebCT, and labs. These exams will **NOT** be cumulative.
