At the end of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Describe conceptual approaches to art practice.
- 2. Effectively discuss and communicate one's informed opinion in relation to contemporary art practice.
- 3. Research and present ideas to groups on the subjects of contemporary art and theoretical practices.
- 4. Identify resources in the arts available to the arts community.

#### 4. Course Content and Schedule

#### 5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

1. Class involvement and participation - 30%

This section is based on the quality of participation of the student. The student will be expected to attend every class session with **5% deducted for every missed** meeting of the whole seminar <u>or</u> smaller group. This applies to classes missed <u>without</u> medical or other unavoidable reasons. (Missing a bus does not count.)

This section will also reflect the level of participation of the student in class discussion. This does not just refer to the act of talking, but also the attention that is being paid to speaker.

2. Notebook/Reviews - 30%

Students will be expected to keep a journal which will contain reviews of visiting artists, gallery exhibits, videos, readings, etc. This 30% breaks down as follows:

Content: 25% Presentation: 5%

Each assignment will be 300 - 350 words and will be handed in at the beginning of the following class. It is important that they are handed in at this time because the class discussion on the topic will follow immediately. Failure to hand in on time will lead to an additional assignment on another topic.

3. Gallery Volunteer Work - 5%

This is a practical work experience at an Artist run centre. It will give the student an opportunity to both observe and participate in the events functions that take place in that environment.

4. Individual Seminar - 35%

This section of the evaluation is the equivalent of the "Term Paper". The student will choose a subject that is of interest to themselves and is relevant to contemporary issues in the Visual Arts. The instructor will meet with the student well before the presentation date to discuss the topic and help the student plan a strategy for the research and preparation of the presentation. The written seminar will be handed in the day of the presentation. The presentation should last 15 - 30 minutes, with the balance of the hour devoted to discussion of the topic.

Each presentation must be illustrated with slides. Alternate presentation formats must be discussed with the instructor. This section of the evaluation breaks down as follows:

#### ART 280 - STUDENT SEMINAR PROJECT

This project will consist of a 2500 - 3000 word research paper that will be accompanied by slides and presented to the seminar class.

The seminar should address the following:

- 1. Its primary function should be to address contemporary issues in the Visual Arts and should contain **no** more than 50% of its references from pre-1980 history.
- 2. It should take approximately 15 30 minutes to present, with the remainder of the hour for questions and discussions.
- 3. It should include 15 25 slides, with the images photocopied and inserted in the appropriate place in the text. These slides should be prepared well in advance so the presentation can be rehearsed.
- 4. It should follow a formal essay structure with title page, footnotes, bibliography and pages numbered.
