Course Objectives: In English 290 you will read three novels and three novellas (by Hynes). All these works include elements of satire and parody: they will amuse, provoke and, perhaps, annoy you at times. By examining the "hot button" issues that form the basis of this genre (the academic satire), we will see whether colleges and universities reflect or create the concerns of the greater society beyond the ivory tower. Some historical/sociological/political analysis will be necessary for a thorough understanding of these works (don't worry - this will be covered in class). As well, we will briefly examine critical literary theory (very briefly) within the context of these works.

Essay topics:

- #1 What, exactly, is the nature of Jim Dixon's struggle in <u>Lucky Jim</u> (ie. what, exactly, is he fighting against?)
- #2 <u>Nice Work</u>, by David Lodge, juxtaposes the worlds of British academia and British industry. Are these worlds at all similar? Discuss.
- #3 <u>Blue Angel</u> is not really a satire, but a realistic depiction of an American university in the 1990s. Discuss.
- #4 Design an essay topic for <u>Publish and Perish</u> and "run" with it (but run it past me, before you start). Your topic may encompass each of the novellas, or just one of them. I will give suggestions, in class, to get you started ahead of time.
