5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

(a) Exercises - 20% of the course grade

There are five exercises in the course. The exercises vary in type, with three of them having to be done in different areas in Victoria. The dates for the explanations of the exercises are shown in the course schedule, as are the due dates. Late exercises will be penalized at a rate of 10% per day.

(b) Mid Term Exam - 27% of the course grade

The Mid Term Exam will cover the material up to the end of "Cultural Regions". The exam will contain a mix of question types. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class on Friday October 22^{nd} .

(c) Final Exam - 27% of the course grade

The Final Exam will cover the material beginning with "Human Behaviour and Landscape" to the end of the course. The exam will contain a mix of question types. The specific format for the exam will be outlined in class on Tuesday December 7th.

(d) Assignment # 1 - 8% of the course grade

This assignment will examine the role of landscape in a feature film. Each student will select one of the films, available on video, from a list provided on the assignment sheet. More specific information will be provided in the seminar on Friday September 17th. The assignment is due on Friday October 15th. Late assignments will have 15% deducted from the given mark.

(e) Assignment # 2 - 18% of the course grade

Each student will select one of the options for this assignment. The options will provide a unique but meaningful approach to learning cultural geography. The options will be explained in the seminar on Friday September 17th. **The assignment is due on Tuesday November 30th. Late Assignments will have 15% deducted from the given mark.**
