1. demonstrate increased understanding and musicianship skills that will strengthen the demands in their instrument/voice.

#### 4. Course Content and Schedule

2 class hours per week; 2 out-of-class hours per week

- 1. Intervals: Identify any melodic interval within the 10<sup>th</sup>
- 2. Chords: Identify, in open position, major and minor triads, dominant and diminished sevenths, dominant 9<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 13<sup>th</sup> in any inversion.
- 3. Chord sequence: Identify by symbols the following chords I, II, IV, V, V7, VI

- 4. Dictation: Write out both voices of a 2-part phrase, a sequence of 6 to 8 chords in SATB chorale style, the upper and lower rhythms of a 2-part phrase
- 5. Listening: Identify major musical events including meter, form, tempo, instrumentation, themes, dynamics and articulation in an orchestral excerpt.
- 6. Keyboard skills: Play a simple melody an dimprovise an accompaniment using poop chord symbols, realize a passage of figured bass
- 7. Improvise: a melody on a given motive, with instrument or voice, 1 to 2 minutes
- 8. Transposition: A melody, at sight, at sight, on an instrument of choice, up to a major third up or down.
- 9. Melody playback: play together, or sing separately, the upper an dlower voices of a 2-part phrase, in a major or minor key.
- 10. Scales: sing major, minor, (natural, melodic, and harmonic) beginning on the tonic, mediant, or dominant; pentatonic, chromatic and whole tone scales beginning on the tonic, ascending and descending, with letter names, solfege or numbers.
- 11. Sight-sing: Sing with solfege syllables a melody in a major or minor key, in the treble, bass, or alto clef.
- 12. Conducting: Sight conduct and intone a given rhythm while maintaining a moderate to fast tempo in 2/4, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 4/4, 5/4, 6/4, 7/4, 6/8, 9/8, 12/8, 15/8, or mixed meter in simple or compound time.

## 5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

- (b) Class Work: 10%
- (c) Mid-term Exam: 30%
- (d) Final Exam: 30%
