

2. Assignments: There will be four of these in total asking you to give an analysis of a disorder, integrate knowledge about a cluster of disorders, consider analysis from different theoretical perspectives, etc. They will be approximately 1-2 pages each, typewritten and double-spaced. They will count for 5% each toward your final grade for a total of 20% from assignments.

3. Individual/Group Presentation: Your choice...you can work independently or in groups up to four people. You'll be giving a 15 minute presentation on a disorder of your choice (a sign-up sheet will be circulated during the second class). The focus will be "psychopathology in BC." You'll give statistics about the current prevalence of your chosen disorder in BC, where you can find resources for information and/or treatment and what community programs exist to help those suffering from your chosen disorder. A detailed outline of the expectations for the presentation will be circulated during the second class. This presentation will be worth 20% of your grade. If you choose to work in groups, all participating group members will receive the same grade.
