### 2. Intended Learning Outcomes

The student will be able to:

- a) **Work** effectively individually and in groups to demonstrate interviewing, hosting, production, and operating skills meeting more advanced standards than required for Radio 2
- b) **Demonstrate** an understanding of the documentary format and produce a documentary meeting assigned criteria
- c) **Understand** and apply techniques for creative radio writing and production and demonstrate their abilities through required assignments.
- d) **Understand** and demonstrate the correct use of selected digital audio and analog studio and field production and post production equipment
- e) **Work** effectively individually and in groups to prepare and present newscasts on Village 900

### **Course Description:**

Students will build on the skills acquired in Radio1 & 2 by learning new technical skills and applying them in more advanced production and performance situations. They will participate in the production of a live, daily news and public affairs program: Focal Point, on Village 900. They will also work in the Village 900 newsroom reporting, writing and reading news. More advanced technical skills such as digital audio production will be stressed, along with more advanced on air presentation skills. Students will acquire research and interviewing experience by producing and hosting a current events program. In addition the student will continue to develop voice, on-air, and presentation skills through regular on-air shifts on Village 900. In addition to the production of Focal Point there will be an increased emphasis on the business of media.
