- your portfolio. This will be comprised of exercises that will be completed during the course (see Reading/Writings schedule above). It will be your responsibility to keep these materials in chronological order (dated), and I will collect your folders on the last day of class. I will be looking for completeness of this folder, and an honest attempt to "grapple" with these exercises.
- Presentations: during the course, you will be asked to present material (xeroxed for each class member and distributed a week ahead of time). The minimum length is one page, but it can be longer (remember you will be xeroxing for each class member). You may be showing how you completed a particular exercise from Stenson's text, or you may be showing a work in progress. You will be asked to talk for about 5 minutes on your presentation, and then invite questions from the rest of the class.
