CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

In this course, students will achieve knowledge of their own and others' integration into society; the ways in which behaviour is and was influenced by groups, stratification, roles, and stereotypes; how and to what extent behaviour is influenced by language, morality, attitudes, prejudices, propaganda, and various leadership roles.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The students will be familiar with the basic vocabulary, concepts, principles and research in the field of social psychology. They will learn to communicate in both written and oral formats about these ideas. They will develop basic library and internet research skills. They will be familiar with thinking in psychological terms and be able to apply those ideas to the self and their social world.

FORMAT

There will be one 2 hour class and one 1 hour class per week in both lecture and seminar style. Some use of the computer for communicating and internet research will be required. Students are expected to attend consistently because new material will be presented in class. Students are also expected to take responsibility for their own learning by doing the assigned reading prior to class. The instructor reserves the right to refuse late assignments or to apply a penalty to them.
