- 1. Voicing for large Jazz Ensembles (4 trumpets/4 trombones/ 5 saxs/4 rhythm)

- 3. Studying scores and listening to recorded examples
- 4. Writing for voices (Jazz choir, etc.)
- 5. Writing for strings
- 6. Transpositions and ranges of voices, strings, wind instruments
